Care Companions is a private pay program that may be covered by some long-term care policies for residents in Brown, Southern Oconto, Northeast Outagamie and Southeast Shawano counties. ## Supportive Care Management – Living Your Best Life Despite Serious Illness

Unity's Supportive Care Management (SCM) program offers palliative care to ease symptoms and emotional stress for people living with serious illness who may be receiving life-prolonging treatment.

Supportive Care Management team members:

- Focus on illness trajectory, prognosis and medical treatments in partnership with your attending provider
- Provide education on disease process and changing care needs
- Review and verify medications
- Discuss symptom management and quality of life
- Offer guidance in completing advance directives (power of attorney for health care, do not resuscitate (DNR) orders, living wills, etc.) to ensure your wishes are documented, shared, and followed
- Refer to community agencies such as hired caregivers, facilities, transportation, and other resources
- Offer emotional and spiritual support, validation, and encouragement for patients and caregivers while respecting your beliefs


More than 60% of SCM patients experienced fewer visits to the emergency room and hospital stays. The data also showed improvement in well-being and overall reductions in patients' pain and shortness of breath after just 60 days on the program.

## Unity Hospice Care offers Unparalleled Support



When curative treatments are no longer effective or desired, Unity is here for you. Offering compassionate, dignified end-of-life care, Unity's goal is to help patients live each day to the fullest. Our expert team works directly with your attending physician to develop a care plan that fulfills endof-life goals.

We focus on the whole person – medically, emotionally and spiritually – rather than the disease. We work to ensure pain and symptom management wherever the patient calls home, while providing guidance, education and support to families and caregivers.

Unity also offers Northeast Wisconsin's only inpatient hospice facility, The Jack and Engrid Meng Hospice Residence. Located in De Pere, this home-like facility, which provides around-the-clock skilled nursing care, features twelve private rooms, specially prepared meals and even allows pet visits.



Unity is committed to providing grief support for students and education to school staff who support them. Acccording to the Childhood Bereavement Estimation Model, 1 in 14 Wisconsin children will experience the death of a parent or sibling by age 18. Research shows children impacted by loss are at increased risk for disrupted development, poor academic performance, and mental health issues. To fill the support gaps in area schools, Unity collaborated with the West De Pere School District to develop a district-wide grief support pilot. During the pilot, support needs were identified and direct care programming was designed, including consultation, individual and group counseling, resources and trainings. This newly designed student and staff grief support programming has been extended to additional districts and has served more than 170 local students and staff.

When asked to share the most helpful aspect of group support students said: "Learning how everyone is different" (grade 5), "Just being allotted time to talk about my person. It feels safe here" (grade 12), "Talking about my feelings and thoughts" (grade 4), "Being together" (grade 2).



Partnering with school districts to offer compassionate and expert grief support has comforted students and empowered staff.


*I've had many meaningful experiences during my 20 years as a Unity volunteer but one stands out:*

## TeleConnect - Real-Time Video Connection and Support

Unity's TeleConnect program provides technology and assistance to facilitate video visits for our patients with Unity Team Members and support system. Started in 2022, Unity piloted the TeleConnect program to assist with triaging symptom-related calls placed to Unity by patients and families.

Unity then added the use of Echo Shows, a voice-activated video calling device, as an option for patients and families. Unity had conducted over 400 virtual visits with patients and families reaching over 150 patients and primary caregivers. During the pilot, TeleConnect was primarily used by Unity Social Workers, Chaplains and Grief Counselors. In 2023, all care staff will receive training and resources to offer this program to all patients and families to help broaden the scope of the program. Unity is grateful to Bader Philanthropies for their very generous grant which made this program possible!
